I'm Barbara Frey, former director of the University of Minnesota's Human Rights Program. I have also served as Executive Director of the Advocates for Human Rights, and I currently sit on the advisory board of Children of Incarcerated Caregivers.

[00:32] Paul Dosh: And I'm Paul Dosh, a former educator at San Quentin Prison and now a Political Science professor at Macalester College. I also serve on the advisory board of Children of Incarcerated Caregivers, also known as CIC.

[00:44] Barbara Frey: CIC researches and disseminates information for policymakers, legal professionals, and community representatives who use this information in the creation of policies, laws, and programs that support children and families who are impacted by caregiver incarceration. This podcast, which was made in collaboration with the University of Minnesota's Human Rights Program, will contribute to this important conversation.

[01:12] Paul Dosh: In this podcast, we speak with experts from around the world in an attempt to understand varying perspectives surrounding the use of prison nurseries as an alternative to caregiver and child separation due to incarceration. By gaining insight into the experiences and perspectives of those involved with prison nurseries, Children of Incarcerated Caregivers hopes to influence legal professionals to consider the risks, benefits, and alternatives to prison nurseries while pushing for more awareness on how to consider the best interests of children during parental sentencing and incarceration.
